DECEMBER 31, 2008

Chairman Way opened the meeting at 9:05 AM.

Chairman Way, Commissioners Saunders and Ogden, County Commissioners Shirley Roloff and Ron Reinhardt, Patrick Harmon and Ina Heaton attended, along with Northwest Design Group (NDG) Engineers Howard Haselschwardt and Amanda Porath, Petoskey News Review reporter Christina Rohn, Zaremba Equipment, Inc. representative Roger Hansen, Charlevoix Township resident John E. Haggard and Truck & Trailer representative Nadine Baker.

Commissioner Saunders moved to accept December 5, 2008 regular meeting minutes as presented, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

Chairman Way invited Shop Foreman Mr. Luchenbill to review Heavy Duty Work Ready Truck bid tabs. Mr. Luchenbill presented the following:

Mr. Luchenbill explained the adjusted price from each best bid was calculated by deducting amount offered to accept 201 stainless steel in place of 304 stainless steel (applicable to dump box and slide-in sander) and adding the amount offered to upgrade to aluminum wheels in place of steel wheels. The deduction/addition was part of the bid package specifications as "options". The adjusted price also includes deduction offered by Zaremba Equipment, Inc. and Peterbilt-Wisconsin to pay chassis portion of bid upon arrival of trucks, and the deduction offered by Dermody Truck Sales Inc. to remove inside/outside air system, making bids more comparable.

Commissioner Ogden moved to accept Zaremba Equipment, Inc. low bid and to purchase two Heavy Duty Work Ready Trucks 5500i SFA International (2009) with Cummins ISX engine with aluminum wheels and substitute 201 stainless (in lieu of 304ss) in upper structure equipment (total cost \$363,763.10), seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

VOTE: Ayes – Saunders, Ogden, Way Nays – 0 Motion carried.

Mr. John E. Haggard proposed to use Concrete Pavement for future Boyne City/Charlevoix Road project to stimulate local business using St. Mary's Cement Company production facilities, which pays significant property tax in Charlevoix County and employs many county residents. He added that concrete pavement quality is good, citing US 31 as an example.

Commissioner Ogden explained concrete pavement in high traffic volume urban areas, when placed at 10-12" thick is appropriate, but is unnecessarily expensive in Northern Michigan where pavement depth of 4" of asphalt will suffice. He also pointed out that after ten years or so, concrete pavement joints begin failing, which requires additional expensive maintenance, and asphalt pavement is much better at absorbing winter sun than the lighter colored concrete; the result being the darker pavement does not form surface ice as quickly as concrete, and it thaws quicker when it does, thereby improving driving surface safety conditions. Commissioner Reinhardt also noted rough concrete joint problems.

Mr. Haselschwardt informed all present the Boyne City/Charlevoix Road & Ellsworth Road soil borings are finished and NDG is in the pavement design process and presumes some Federal funds and County Road Millage money will be used. Chairman Way and Commissioner Ogden offered to discuss using concrete pavement when funding sources are determined and alternative design information is provided by NDG.

Recessed at 10:00; resumed at 10:15.

Mr. Haselschwardt presented Ellsworth Road design proposal. The estimated cost to construct the East Jordan-Ellsworth Road is about \$1,7000,000.00 -\$1,9000,000.00.

Mr. Haselschwardt also presented a proposal and brief site plan layout for constructing a new Road Commission maintenance garage at a new location on Beaver Island. The Beaver Island garage proposal will be submitted to CRAM office and to the Michigan Department of Transportation as a request to fund this long standing need under the possible expanded Federal Stimulus package. Commissioner Roloff agreed that the Beaver Island garage facility should be reconstructed to modern standards as a means of improving services to Beaver Island's residents.

Mr. Harmon presented the Clerks Fiscal Year January 1 to December 31, 2008 estimated year-end Budget.

Commissioner Ogden moved to accept the Clerks Fiscal Year January 1 to December 31, 2008 Estimated Year-end Budget (Amendment 6) as follows, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

Chairman Way, Commissioners Saunders and Ogden, County Commissioners Shirley Roloff and Ron Reinhardt, Patrick Harmon, James Vanek and Shelley Kondrat attended, along with Northwest Design Group (NDG) engineer Howard Haselschwardt.

Commissioner Saunders moved to accept November 24, 2008 regular meeting minutes as presented, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

Commissioner Saunders moved to accept December 1, 2008 special meeting minutes as corrected, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

Mr. Harmon read Northwest Michigan Council of Government (NWMCOG) representative Sarah Merz email requesting eligible road project information for proposed Federal Stimulus program. She needs this information no later than Wednesday, December 10, 2008. Mr. Harmon will request that NWMCOG consider the Boyne City-Charlevoix Road project, and the Ellsworth Road project as Charlevoix County's highest priority projects that should be funded through the Federal Stimulus package.

Mr. Haselschwardt presented a detailed summary of the Boyne City-Charlevoix Road and Ellsworth Road rehabilitation projects and provided fact sheets and location maps.

Boyne City-Charlevoix Road rehabilitation (13.65 miles Boyne City limits to Western Avenue):

- Traffic count is over 3,000 vehicles per day, 8% commercial.
- Existing roadway is two 11 ft. wide asphalt lanes (constructed in the 1950's).
- Proposed project is two 12 ft. wide paved lanes with 4-8 ft. paved shoulders.
- Includes storm sewer through Horton Bay.
- Engineer's Estimate: \$6,826,800.

Ellsworth Road rehabilitation (3.79 miles from East Jordan city limits to the Antrim county line):

- Traffic count is over 2,000 vehicles per day, 11% commercial.
- Existing roadway is two 11 ft. wide asphalt lanes.
- Proposed project is two 12 ft. wide paved lanes with 3-8 ft. paved shoulders.
- Engineer's Estimate: \$1,879,400.

Both rehabilitation projects:

- Are classified as Rural Minor Arterials, same as nearby M75, M32 and M66.
- Will bring routes up to all-season standards, providing year-round access for commercial traffic.
- Will be designed to meet current AASHTO AND MDOT 3R standards.
- Will have drainage improvements.
- Will reduce maintenance costs.
- Will, most importantly, enhance public safety by constructing wider pavement, correcting curve super elevations & side-road intersection geometry, and adding guardrail.

Commissioner Saunders moved to authorize manager Patrick Harmon to sign Northwest Design Group \$152,000 Boyne City-Charlevoix Road engineering contract, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

Commissioner Ogden moved to elect CCRC manager Patrick Harmon voting member for 1:00PM January 08, 2009 SAFETEA-LU Sub-Task Force 10-A Meeting at Emmet County Friendship Center on Anderson Road, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

Mr. Vanek reported Holy Island bridge replacement pre-construction meeting was Wednesday, December 3, 2008, attended by contractor Davis Construction, MDOT resident engineer Judy Browning and NDG engineer Amanda Porath. Project onset is January 5, 2009 with a May 28, 2009 completion date. The super structure will be completed 8-10 weeks after Mrs. Porath approves the shop drawings.

Recessed at 10:10 AM; resumed at 10:20 AM.

Mr. Harmon:

- Requested CCRC purchase a 30' lift to aid CCRC employees when trimming trees, conducting building maintenance, changing traffic lights, etc. Two options are an electrically lifted platform with stabilizer legs that is pulled behind a pickup truck, or 1-ton 4WD truck equipped with a lift, utility box, hydraulic controls and a hydraulic chainsaw, pruning saw and post pounder (approximately \$100,000-\$110,000).
- Reported the County Road Association of Michigan (CRAM) legal council said, as long as Michigan Transportation Funds (MTF) are not utilized, CCRC can lease the County a pickup truck and snowplow for County building and sheriff department parking lot winter maintenance. The County would have to reimburse CCRC 100% for equipment use and maintenance, insure borrowed equipment and list CCRC as a named insured on their liability and comprehensive insurance policy.
- Said CRAM legal council and Charlevoix Township are supporting CCRC in the Beach Drive lawsuit by sending rebuttals to Appellate Court.

Commissioner Ogden moved to pay bills totaling \$124,227.18, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

Mr. Harmon:

- Informed all present the Local Task Force meeting is 7:00 PM December 11, 2008; Mr. Harmon will chair the meeting as in the past.
- Reported first countywide road millage collection will be on December 2009 tax statements.
- Requested Trails Council share Boyne City-Charlevoix Road topographical aerial survey; the Trails Council director agreed if CCRC pays an \$8,000 fee. Mr. Harmon feels if CCRC shares its base plan and soil boring results in return, there should be no fees involved; additionally the aerial survey isn't as accurate as a manual survey. He presented Northwest Design Group \$8,960 survey estimate; and will obtain Ferguson & Chamberlain Associates, Inc. estimate as well.
- Presented State Representative Kevin Elsenheimer letter regarding HB 5808, Section 395 which reads "It is the intent
 of the legislature that the department (MDOT) assume jurisdiction of county road C-56 (Boyne City-Charlevoix Road)
 between US-31 at Charlevoix and M-75 at Boyne City in Charlevoix County."
- Explained 2009 Melrose Township Walloon Lake public boat launch reconstruction project, which includes a paved parking area, sidewalks, a catch basin installation, and curbing & repaving a portion of Winsor Street in Walloon Lake Village (funded by a DNR grant & township local match).
- Will visit Beaver Island in early December; Commissioner Roloff may accompany him.

Commissioner Roloff reported a large pothole in Boyne City-Charlevoix Road westbound lane, ¼ mile west of Maple Grove Road intersection.

Mr. Vanek informed all present Holy Island Bridge replacement preconstruction meeting is 9:00 AM December 3, 2008. The dredging portion outside the right-of-way will be approximately \$28,000, rather than \$92,000 originally estimated. CCRC 5% local match will be less than anticipated as well.

Commissioner Saunders asked if a Boyne City garage truck driver has been reassigned to the Ironton garage for the winter; Mr. Harmon replied yes.

Recessed at 10:07AM; resumed at 10:20AM.

Mr. Luchenbill stated Wolverine Tractor & Equipment offering the Volvo G940 Motor Grader was low bidder meeting specifications at \$64,150 (\$199,200 bid less \$137,000 trade-in allowance, plus \$1,950 for the 11-speed transmission). After checking bid submission and references, he recommends the Board award the bid to Wolverine Tractor for the Volvo G940 contingent upon an in-house warranty option, if the wing plow (salvaged from the trade-in grader) will fit the Volvo G940 and if the performance bond is included. Mr. Luchenbill will report his findings to the Board December 1, 2008 for the Boards further review and probable award.

reservation of an easement for utility purposes. Furthermore, the Road Commission Board has determined that such abandonment shall only become effective upon the dedication and transfer to the Road Commission of a newly constructed and relocated portion of Pincherry Road to replace the portion being abandoned.

THEREFORE, pursuant to MCL 224.18(5), it is resolved by the Road Commission Board of Charlevoix County, Michigan, that the above described portion of the Charlevoix County road system covered by the petition be abandoned and discontinued as a county road, subject to the reservation by the Road Commission of a public and private utility easement within the abandoned right-of-way, whereby utility companies, their agents and contractors have the right to use any manpower and equipment necessary to install, maintain and repair their utilities.

Because this abandonment is part of the proposed relocation of the subject portion of Pincherry Road, this Abandonment Resolution is expressly contingent upon fulfillment of the following conditions:

- 1. **Construction of Relocated Portion of Roadway.** Construction by Rieth-Riley Construction Co., Inc. ("Rieth-Riley"), at its cost and risk, of the relocated portion of Pincherry Road that will replace the portion of Pincherry Road that is the subject of this abandonment. The typical cross-section standards for construction of the relocated portion of the roadway are indicated on the three (3) pages of drawings prepared by Benchmark Engineering, Inc., dated December 3, 2007, that are on file with the Road Commission and made a part of these conditions
- 2. **Dedication of Relocated Portion of Roadway.** Upon completion of such construction, the receipt of Warranty Deeds from Rieth-Riley, Carl Price and Judith Price, husband and wife, and any other necessary parties, conveying and dedicating to the Road Commission the newly-constructed, relocated portion of Pincherry Road and the property on which said portion of the roadway is located. The location and legal descriptions of the relocated portion of the roadway are indicated on the three (3) pages of drawings prepared by Benchmark Engineering, Inc., dated December 3, 2007, that are on file with the Road Commission and made a part of these conditions.
- 3. **Conveyance Free from Liens and Encumbrances.** The Grantors of the real estate being conveyed to the Road Commission pursuant to condition #2 above, shall obtain the satisfaction, resolution, discharge, or release of any liens, encumbrances, or other title conditions affecting title to the subject property.
- 4. **Land Division Approval.** The Grantors shall obtain any land division approval from Hayes Township needed for the conveyance of the real estate to the Road Commission pursuant to condition #2, above.

This Abandonment Resolution shall be held in escrow pending the satisfaction of these conditions and shall only be effective upon satisfaction of these conditions and the release from escrow of a certified copy of this Resolution bearing the seal of the Road Commission and the original signature of the Clerk of the Road Commission on the Clerk's Certification indicated below. Upon satisfaction of these conditions and the release of the certified copy of this Resolution from escrow, said certified copy shall be recorded in the office of the Charlevoix County Register of Deeds. However, in the event the conditions indicated in this Resolution are not satisfied by June 30, 2009, this Resolution shall not become effective and any certified copy in escrow shall remain unrecorded and shall be immediately returned to the Road Commission Clerk.

It is further resolved that a certified copy of this Resolution shall be recorded in the office of the Charlevoix County Register of Deeds upon its release from escrow.

Mr. Meeker opposes House Bill #4323, legislation allowing Off-Road Vehicle (ORV) travel on public roadways. Mr. Harmon said the County Board or individual townships have authority to adopt or reject ORV use on public roads.

Mr. Marrs said Curtis Lane (Bay Township) has 19 residents, 16 of which are interested in a special assessment with the township to pave this .27 mile road. He requested a variance from CCRC specified 22' width to Curtis Lanes current 18' width. Commissioner Ogden said CCRC will not relax its 22' minimum standard because larger traffic (school buses, garbage trucks, etc.) cannot safely pass when approaching from opposite directions. In fact, CCRC encourages 23' width for township local road projects and 25' width for township primary road projects. Mr. Marrs argued Curtis Lane is a dead end road and there are no school aged children on this road. Commissioner Ogden said Afton stone could be applied with proper drainage. Mr. Vanek will suggest Afton stone road locations for Mr. Marrs to view, after which Mr. Marrs will talk with other homeowners and report.

Mrs. Meeker said CCRC (unnecessarily in her opinion) recently cut trees, trimmed brush and graded seasonal Holmes Road, damaging the roadway. Mr. Harmon said CCRC owns 66' by statute and has since sent a grader operator to repair

said damage. She and Mr. Meeker feel this was a waste of money. Chairman Way stated CCRC must grade seasonal roads so they are not lost from the county system.

Mrs. Meeker added they have problems with dirt bikes and 4-wheelers cutting around the gate across Holmes Road (they own the property on both sides of the road) to get to the highway. Mr. Harmon said they can petition to abandon that portion of roadway, but suggested they get written permission from the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) before they pay the \$350 CCRC public hearing fee. Until then, Mr. Harmon will have "Dead End, No Outlet" sign placed.

Mrs. Porath presented Holy Island Bridge replacement project final plans for signatures and explained plans in detail. The plans must be received by MDOT this week for a November 7, 2008 bid letting (project onset January 2009; completion date May 28, 2009).

TOWNSHIP LETTER

The Road Commission Board and staff recently reviewed our annual cost share policies we offer the townships. For 2008, we will provide engineering services at no cost, as we've done in the past. Our gravel policy is reduced from last years program, but we will provide a grader and operator when a township pays for gravel, and the cost of trucking the gravel to the jobsite.

Our sealcoat policy is the same as last year. We do not perform sealcoat work with our own forces as we did years ago, instead we bid the work for contractors to perform. The Road Commission contributes \$2,000 per mile when a township wants a contractor to sealcoat local hard surface roads. Any sealcoat work on primary roads will continue to be a Road Commission responsibility.

If a township prefers to have a contractor place an 1½-inch asphalt overlay, rather than sealcoat to preserve or restore an existing hard surface road, the Road Commission will contribute \$2,000 per mile toward contractor costs to perform the overlay work. To qualify for the asphalt overlay policy the road must have an existing restorable surface and solid base. Since asphalt is much more costly than sealcoat, the Road Commission wants to insure that money spent on asphalt will economically extend roadway longevity. Totally deteriorated hard surface roads would not qualify for an overlay (which is a heavy maintenance procedure) but instead, should be considered reconstruction, which the Road Commission does not cost share this year. Where a hard surface road does not meet current standards for width or crown, townships are encouraged to consider wedging and widening prior to overlay.

Due to continued funding shortfalls, the Road Commission does not have the money to offer the general asphalt share policy (where in the past the Road Commission paid for 1/3 the cost of 3-inches of asphalt during new construction). Road Commission funding throughout the state these past few years has been flat, and in some years declined; for example, state gas tax revenues were less in 2007 than they were 10 years ago. To insure a balanced budget, we've had to reduce our cost share programs accordingly. We have also reduced staff and curtailed overtime (which affects winter maintenance quality), have postponed much needed equipment replacement, and reduced material usage wherever possible. Unless the legislature provides us a funding increase, the likelihood of any future improvement in our existing cost share policies is remote.

APRIL 28, 2008

Commissioner Ogden moved to accept April 14, 2008 regular meeting minutes with the following changes, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

Page 1, line 15: delete "isn't 100% available, and the qualifying money isn't guaranteed" and add "; the letter explained that the Road Commission doesn't qualify for any funds the alliance is aware of, and further, recommended a citizens millage as the best way to generate road funds"

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

Mr. Allen reminded all to attend the Michigan Township Association (MTA) 7:30 PM meeting tonight; proposed countywide road millage (and wording) will be discussed. All present discussed original plan expansion to include road improvements in other areas (original 44.08 miles to 61.34 miles), current average annual car repair costs throughout the state of Michigan due to bad roads is \$318, cost per household for millage, presentation on general election ballot, etc.

Commissioner Ogden moved to approve the Horton Bay Parade Committee permit application request to allow Boyne City-Charlevoix Road closure in Horton Bay, July 4, 2008 between 12:15 PM and 2:30 PM, and to allow Boyne City-Charlevoix Road closure September 1, 2008 for "Horton Bay Bridge Walk" from 9:00 to 10:00 PM (Sheriff Lasater has approved both closures and will provide necessary manpower and traffic control), seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

Commissioner Ogden moved to open Mercer Road and Old Orchard Road shoulder paving project bids (Charlevoix Township) at 10:30 AM May 12, 2008, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

VOTE: Ayes − 2 Nays − 0 Absent − 1 Motion carried.

Commissioner Ogden moved to open Sequanota Road wedge, widen and overlay project bids (Eveline Township) for 10:30 AM May 12, 2008, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

Mr. Harmon met with Otec Radio Communication representative Pete VanDenBerge who quoted \$4,189.80 if CCRC purchases repeater, repeater package and 4 portable radios now (originally estimated \$5,000-\$8,000). Other radio upgrades, and radio and base unit replacements will be done at a later date.

Commissioner Ogden moved to accept Otec Radio Communication quote and to prepare \$4,189.80 purchase order for radio upgrades, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

Commissioner Reinhardt asked if fill placed over corduroy through Barber Road swamp before Afton stone placement would hold up. Mr. Harmon said fill would force sludge that the corduroy is holding down out into the swamp, causing further problems.

- Said residents are requesting speed limit signs in Port St. James Association on Beaver Island. Mr. Harmon

 Michigan Basic Speed Law booklet.

Commissioner Ogden said Pearsall Road at bridge is washing out on shoulder and undermining the pavement. Mr. Harmon will have Mr. Thompson investigate.

Mr. Reinhardt said heavy trucks are traveling Deer Lake Road and breaking it up even worse; Mr. Harmon will ask Mr. Phelps to have company (Howes and Howes) drive Boyne City-East Jordan Road through to M75.

Commissioner Ogden moved to pay bills totaling \$73,649.00, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

Commissioner Ogden moved to purchase 1,000 cyd manufactured gravel (on Beaver Island) at \$13.00/cyd from R. Gillespie Enterprises, Inc., seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

Recess at 10:20 AM; resumed at 10:30 AM.

APRIL 16, 2008

Chairman Way called the meeting to order at 9:00 AM.

Chairman Way, Commissioners Saunders and Ogden, County Commissioner Reinhardt, Patrick Harmon, James Vanek and Shelley Kondrat attended.

Commissioner Saunders moved to accept March 24, 2008 regular meeting minutes with the following changes, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

Page 1, line 36: add "above" after "inspect"

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 3 Nays – 0 Motion carried.

Mr. Harmon:

- Presented Northern Lakes Economic Alliance (NLEA) letter explaining funding for Boyne City-Charlevoix Road reconstruction (from Boyne City limits to US31) ien't 100% available, and the qualifying money ien't guaranteed; the letter explained that the Road Commission doesn't qualify for any funds the alliance is aware of, and further, recommended a citizens millage as the best way to generate road funds.
- Presented and explained Otec Communication Systems correspondence explaining FCC mandating changes in how mobile radio systems are licensed and used (must be met by 2011 and 2012). The new band width will be narrowed to increase capacity. Mr. Harmon and Mr. VanDenBerge (Otec representative) will conduct on-site review of CCRC mobile radios, repeaters, base stations, and Wildwood Harbor Road tower to explain required updates.

Commissioner Ogden moved to transfer \$132,669 from the Insurance Fund to the General Fund to pay Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool (MCRCSIP) compensation insurance renewal invoice no. 3477, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

VOTE: Ayes – Saunders, Way, Ogden Nays – 0 Motion carried.

Commissioner Ogden moved to open M-32 State Highway pavement repair project bids at 10:30 AM April 28, 2008, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 3 Nays – 0 Motion carried.

Commissioner Saunders feels the Board should make a decision on township share policies; the Board directed the staff to form an outline for April 28, 2008 presentation.

Commissioner Reinhardt:

- Asked if CCRC pre-buys diesel fuel; Mr. Harmon said no, Act51 requires bids; but CCRC does buy it for \$0.04 over rack price (delivered) for a 12-month period.
- Is pleased the Afton stone is holding well on Barber Road and, Mr. Harmon added, Healey Road.
- Will attend Boyne Valley Township meeting soon; Commissioner Ogden and Mr. Harmon will as well.
- Appreciates CCRC attending township meetings with him (Commissioner Ogden attended Hudson Township meeting as well).

Commissioner Ogden moved to transfer \$100,000 from General Fund to Preventive Maintenance Fund to repay June 6, 2007 loan, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 3 Nays – 0 Motion carried.

Mr. Harmon:

Ordered all backup salt plus 30% allowable increase.

- Said Mr. Vaneks pickup truck transmission needs replacement and the body is physically falling apart; the road foremen pickup trucks have over 100,000 miles on them. Mr. Harmon would like to purchase two new pickup trucks for the road foremen, give Mr. Vanek one of the road foremen trucks and put the other road foremen truck into the fleet. The Board directed Mr. Harmon to have shop foreman Mick Luchenbill prepare specifications.
- Reported the loader needs new tires, costing \$1,000 each.
- Weight restrictions will probably be lifted next Tuesday or Wednesday, for sure west of US131, but hopefully countywide.
- He and Mr. Vanek will attend all-day asset management training in Gaylord tomorrow.

Mr. Vanek reported he, Commissioner Ogden and Mr. Harmon met with H&D representative Todd Colberg (retiree Glen Hodgkiss' replacement) to discuss center joint construction failures on various past projects. Future CCRC centerline joint construction specifications will be changed.

Commissioner Ogden:

- Asked if CCRC was committed to Coash Road gravel project; Mr. Harmon said Coash Road was never bid, only Woodward Road gravel project was bid in 2007, after which it was agreed McGregor Road (an extension of Woodward Road) gravel application could be done for the same price. Mr. Vanek will explain situation to Hudson Township clerk Frank Wasylewski and bid Coash Road gravel application to comply with Act51.
- Talked with Wilson Township supervisor Todd Sorenson after the March MTA meeting, who said Wilson Township only plans gravel and brine projects in 2008. The township hopes to pave Pleasant Valley and/or Jaquay Road in 2009.

Mr. Harmon updated Board on Beach Drive lawsuit. Judge Pajtas ruled in CCRC favor to date and denied plaintiffs appeal for reconsideration. He ordered mediation before August 1st and instructed all parties to work out their differences. The plaintiffs have filed in Appellate Court to hear the case prior to a final ruling.

Chairman Way said the Coastguard has added a new inspection which must be done before the Ironton Ferry can be returned to the water. The inspection is Tuesday, April 22, 2008 so the ferry should be ready for use hopefully by the end of next week.

Mr. Harmon reported MTA chairman and Melrose Township supervisor Mike Webster would like all CCRC Board members and manager to attend April 28, 2008 MTA meeting regarding a countywide road millage bond proposal. He has also invited the Charlevoix County Board, Chambers, Lions Clubs, etc.

Commissioner Saunders moved to pay bills totaling \$137,501.81, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

MARCH 24, 2008

Vice-Chairman Saunders opened the meeting at 9:00 AM.

Commissioners Saunders and Ogden, County Commissioners Ron Reinhardt, Shirley Roloff and Shirlene Tripp, Patrick Harmon and James Vanek attended. Commissioner Way and Clerk Shelly Kondrat were absent.

Commissioner Ogden moved to approve March 10, 2008 regular meeting minutes with the following corrections, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

Page 1, line 37: add "Ogden" after "Commissioner"

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

Commissioner Ogden moved to change 9:00 AM, Monday April 14, 2008 meeting to 9:00 AM, Wednesday, April 16, 2008 to allow Manager to attend April 14, 2008 Beach Drive (Charlevoix Township) Circuit Court hearing, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

Mr. Harmon explained the Road Commission received and deposited into the Equipment Fund the Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool (MCRCSIP) \$127,473.50 check for totaled (wrecked) Truck #52 (includes sander #352,

underbody scraper #552, front plow #652 and Kenwood/Mobile radio). Shop Foreman Mick Luchenbill will prepare bid document for two trucks; replace Truck #52 and an additional truck.

Harmon presented Beaver Island Community School expansion site plan showing proposed Kings Highway storm sewer system connection and new entrances onto Kings Highway. The Board reviewed the site plan and requires the following:

- Road Commission permit required for proposed work.
- Performance Bond may be required.
- Bituminous pavement saw-cut locations on Kings Highway shall be replaced with hot mix asphalt, not concrete as the consultant proposes.
- New entrance radii onto Kings Highway shall be 50-FT, increased from consultants proposed 18-FT.

The Board recommended having Staff Engineer Vanek inspect above new storm sewer installation to ensure all work within the right-of-way meets Road Commission standards for roadway integrity and longevity.

Public Comment:

Ken Allen (Concerned Citizens of Charlevoix County representative) reviewed proposed county bond initiative to reconstruct various county roads; will be presenting this information to the County Board. Allen also suggested reconstructing Boyne City-Charlevoix Road in conjunction with the proposed bike path along Boyne City-Charlevoix Road.

Mr. Harmon:

- Presented March 17, 2008 MCRCSIP memorandum regarding available MCRCSIP Board of Director positions.
- Hired Liz Durbin to fill advertised Clerical position; Durbin will work part-time (up to 30 hrs. per week depending on need).

Commissioner Reinhardt:

- Asked if new heavy truck emission standards exhaust system placement and underbody blade conflict have been resolved; Harmon stated truck manufactures have resolved equipment conflict.
- Wolverine Power Company has narrowed property search in Wilson Township to build an electrical substation near their powerline preferably on an all-season paved road to two locations; Pleasant Valley Road (approx. 1-Mile South of Behling Rd. near Charlie Griffins property) and just off Boyne City-East Jordan Road (near Ron Reinhardt's property). Concerned Pleasant Valley Road is not an all-season road and could be damaged if a heavy transformer had to be replaced during seasonal weight restrictions.

Commissioner Roloff questioned Road Commission diesel supply at Beaver Island garage (recent gasoline rationing in effect due to limited supply and no fuel deliveries since Beaver Island Boat Company's winter shut-down). Harmon stated the Road Commission diesel supply is adequate.

Commissioner Tripp complimented road crews on keeping potholes patched.

Mr. Vanek stated Melrose Township will fund 20% local match for Bear River reconstruction project (U.S.-131 to Maple Hill Road); Little Traverse Bay Band of Odawa Indians will fund the remaining 80%, up to \$350,000.00. Pavement width will match Emmet County Road Commissions newly reconstructed portion and have a 4-Inch pavement depth.

Commission Ogden:

- Asked if County Commissioner Tripp's shoulder plowing concern near her driveway had been addressed.
 Commissioner Tripp stated everything is fine.
- Logging operation damaged a portion of Walker Road. Harmon will have crews repair section this spring.

Commissioner Ogden moved to pay bills totaling \$148,485.46, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – Saunders, Ogden Nays – 0 Absent – Way Motion carried.

Vice-Chairman Saunders adjourned the meeting at 10:53 AM.

MARCH 10, 2008

Vice-Chairman Saunders opened the meeting at 9:00 AM.

Commissioners Saunders and Ogden, County Commissioners Ron Reinhardt, Shirley Roloff and Shirlene Tripp, Patrick Harmon and James Vanek attended. Commissioner Way and Clerk Shelly Kondrat were absent.

Commissioner Ogden moved to approve February 22, 2008 regular meeting minutes as presented, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

Reviewed 2008 Annual Materials bid tabulations. Mr. Harmon stated Sutliff pit 23A gravel stockpile is nearly depleted. Limited Road Commission funds do not allow processing more 23A gravel; gravel will have to be purchased on an asneeded basis from the annual bids.

Commissioner Ogden moved to accept all 2008 Annual Material bids and that the manager, or his designee, be authorized to purchase from the 2008 bidders list any necessary items; all purchases must be in the Road Commissions best financial interest, seconded by Vice-Chairman Saunders.

FEBRUARY 22, 2008

Chairman Way opened the meeting at 9:03 AM.

Chairman Way, Commissioner Ogden, County Commissioner Ron Reinhardt, Patrick Harmon and James Vanek attended. Commissioner Saunders and Clerk Shelly Kondrat were absent.

Commissioner Ogden moved to approve February 11, 2008 regular meeting minutes with the following corrections, seconded by Chairman Way.

Page 1, line 18: replace "years" with "year".

Page 1, line 38: replace "Kondrat" with "Kondrat's".

Page 1, line 38: delete "for medical reasons".

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

Mr. Harmon presented 2008 Road Certification Map showing local Eagle Island Road, Bay Township 0.17 mile extension to existing Eagle Island Road; and Glenwood Drive to Glenwood Beach Drive name change, Evangeline Township.

Commissioner Ogden moved to approve 2008 Road Certification Map as presented, seconded by Commissioner Way.

VOTE: Ayes − 2 Nays − 0 Absent − 1 Motion carried.

Mr. Harmon presented February 11, 2008 Don Vyse letter (St. James Township Supervisor) regarding January 20, 2008 Charlevoix Courier newspaper article featuring the Concerned Citizens of Charlevoix County groups efforts for a proposed county wide road millage ballot proposal. Harmon will send a response letter to Mr. Vyse inviting him to a future Concerned Citizens of Charlevoix County meeting.

Discussed Citizens Research Council (CRC) of Michigan February 2008 publication regarding alternate way to distribute state transportation revenues among county road commissions from road mileage to road usage, resulting in funding loss to 65 of the 83 road commissions.

Discussed Michigan Township Association (MTA) Charlevoix County Chapter upcoming February 25, 2008 meeting, with guest speaker State Representative Kevin Elsenheimer.

Recessed from 10:12 AM to 10:18 AM.

Mr. Harmon:

- Met with City of Boyne City and Sommerset Pointe representatives regarding proposed city utility extension (sewer and water lines) along Lake Shore Drive, from the city limits to Sommerset Point condominium project in Advance. Harmon explained Summerset Point presented three utility installation options (all options directionally drilled):
 - 1. Purchase 15-FT easement beyond road commission right-of-way, on south side of Lake Shore Drive, for water line installation; sewer line in ditch location (10-FT water and sewer line separation required).
 - 2. Water line in ditch area; sewer line in eastbound lane (towards Boyne City). This option requires eastbound lane to be pulverized at bore pit locations (approximately every 1,000-FT), with manholes spaced approximately every 1,000-FT near roadway centerline; pulverized areas would be repaved then entire road overlayed.
 - 3. Sewer line in eastbound lane; water line in westbound lane (least desirable option).

The Board agreed that Lake Shore Drive pavement integrity would be jeopardized by removing the existing 7-lnch pavement (from ¼ crown out to paved shoulder edge) for utility installation and recommended utilities not be placed within the paved portion of Lake Shore Drive.

Commissioner Reinhardt:

- Farm Bureau supports Antrim County proposal allowing All-Terrain Vehicles (ATV's) on the county road system.
- Wolverine Power Company is searching for approximately 5-acres in Wilson Township to build an electrical substation near their powerline on an all-season paved road.

Mr. Harmon:

County back-up salt order placed February 11, 2008. 100 ton State salt has been delivered to each garage, but is unsure if any more will be delivered. Harmon stated Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) salt contract is vague regarding deductions for salt contract non-compliance (it appears there may not be any more salt available this winter for agencies who order through the state purchasing program).

Commissioner Ogden moved to pay bills totaling \$110,523.18, seconded by Chairman Way.

VOTE: Ayes – Way, Ogden Nays – 0 Absent – Saunders Motion carried.

Chairman Way adjourned the meeting at 11:05 AM.

FEBRUARY 11, 2008

Chairman Way opened the meeting at 9:02 AM.

Chairman Way, Commissioner Ogden, County Commissioner Ron Reinhardt, Patrick Harmon and James Vanek attended, along with Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool (MCRCSIP) representative Mike Shultz and Petoskey News-Review reporter Fred Gray. Commissioner Saunders and Clerk Shelly Kondrat were absent.

Commissioner Ogden moved to approve January 28, 2008 regular meeting minutes as presented, seconded by Chairman Way.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – 2 Nays – 0 Absent – 1 Motion carried.

MCRCSIP representative Mike Shultz introduced himself and stated he completed a routine Boyne City garage "loss control" visit. Shultz complimented the Board for hosting an annual spring safety meeting for road commission employees, which he feels has reduced the road commission's exposure to liability, and has improved safety.

Mr. Shultz explained 2008-2009 insurance premiums may be lower than last years due to less claims being paid. Also, member road commissions may receive an insurance refund after the MCRCSIP Board of Directors actuaries are complete.

- Suggested advertising for a temporary clerk, to fill in during Mrs. Kondrat's absence. for medical reasons. Board agreed the position needs to be filled during her absence. Antrim County Road Commission clerk will assist this week to complete January month-end procedures.

Fred Gray requested winter budget financial update. Harmon stated increased fuel and material costs and decreased Michigan Transportation Fund (MTF) revenues have caused the Road Commission to borrow \$400,000 from various funds to pay for general daily operations.

Commissioner Ogden:

- Received Wilson Road (gravel portion) winter maintenance compliment.
- Presented proposed county wide road millage ballot and bonding language. Proposed language will be forward to the "Concerned Citizens of Charlevoix County" group leaders.

Commissioner Way reviewed 2007 Ironton Ferry revenues as compared to 2006 revenues, noting a \$127,000 year end fund balance, which will pay for ferry removal and inspection (dry dock) and engine overhaul.

Commissioner Ogden moved to pay bills totaling \$62,414.61, seconded by Chairman Way.

Northwest Design Group (NDG) representatives Howard Haselschwardt and Lucas Porath presented their engineering services proposal to prepare plans and bid documents to reconstruct approximately 13 Miles of the Boyne City-Charlevoix Road. Project includes full roadway reconstruction (32-FT minimum pavement width, 4-Inch Pavement depth) with new pavement meeting all-season standards and various safety upgrades to meet American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) geometric design standards, Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) Local Agency Program Guidelines for Geometrics and Road Commission proposed design standards.

Haselschwardt explained an existing digital terrain model (DTM), owned by the Top of Michigan Trails Counsel, would help identify alignment, drainage and sight distance improvements, but permission is needed to use the DTM data.

The \$152,000 fee estimate (preliminary design, which is approximately 3% of the estimated construction costs) includes Road Commission Staff Engineer James Vanek assisting NDG with preliminary engineering design work and perform construction inspection and project documentation.

The Board thanked NDG for their engineering services proposal presentation and explained that once funding is secured, preliminary engineering and plan preparation will be needed.

Road Commission Board and Manager presented recent retiree Lionel McClanaghan with a plaque to recognize his 20 years of Road Commission employment. McClanaghan thanked the Road Commission Board and appreciated what the Road Commission has done for him during his 20 years of employment.

Newly appointed Norwood Township Supervisor, Tim Boyko, introduced himself and the Norwood Township Road Committee members; Rod Richardson, Bill Gnodtke and Denny Way (also Norwood Township Trustee).

Way explained Banks Township (Antrim County) plans to pave their portion of Lake Shore Drive (14-FT pavement width) and approached Norwood Township to see if a joint project was feasible (similar to the 2001 Richardson Road joint paving project). Harmon stated Banks Township 14-FT proposed pavement width does not meet current Road Commission pavement width standards (22-FT minimum) and AASHTO pavement width standards for low volume roads (18-FT minimum).

Way asked for suggestions to reduce erosion on Lake Street hill. Harmon stated paving the hill with bituminous curbs and replacing the existing undersized storm sewer near Second Street would correct drainage problems. Afton Stone gravel placement would be a good alternate in-lieu of paving.

Bill Gnodtke questioned Richardson Road pavement edge cracking. Harmon stated the pavement thickness was only 2-lnches; also water seeps under pavement edge freezing in winter causing edge cracking.

Tim Boyko questioned recent Lake Shore Drive (Clipperview Rd. south) drainage and gravel project. 23A Limestone gravel surface seemed very muddy and rutted this fall. Harmon stated the gravel surface should improve after going through a "freeze/thaw" cycle. The grader will reshape road this spring to ensure road slopes to the new ditch.

Harmon presented County Road Association's 37th Senatorial District Council committee member list, with vacancies to be discussed and decided at the 37th Senatorial District Council's February 4, 2008 meeting.

Reviewed proposed changes to the 2008-2009 CRAM draft policies. Harmon highlighted minor changes to Policy No. 8 and Policy No. 11; major proposed wordage changes would disallow CRAM member county road commissions a final vote on proposed changes at the annual business meeting. The proposed language suggests the CRAM General Policy Committee would have sole authority to approve all policy amendments.

Commissioner Roloff:

Requested update regarding recent meeting on transferring Ellsworth Road jurisdiction to the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT). Harmon stated since jurisdictional transfer to MDOT is unlikely, the group is focusing on county road commissions retaining jurisdiction and finding reconstruction monies from Michigan Economic Development grant funds, along with various other grant funding sources, since an Ellsworth business proposes to expand and create new jobs.

Mr. Harmon:

- Explained there will be a retirement dinner for recently retired Presque Isle Road Commission manager Eric Rose at the Great Lakes Crossing restaurant in Cheboygan.
- Truck and Trailer Specialties is scheduling a bus trip and tour of the Monroe Truck Equipment factory in Wisconsin May 6-7, 2008.

Recessed at 10:20 AM; resumed at 10:30 AM.

Commissioner Ogden:

Distributed a follow-up memorandum regarding simplified county wide road millage ballot wordage. Ogden
recommended to County Commissioners Roloff and Reinhardt to have the proposed ballot wordage reviewed by
a law firm that specializes in ballot proposals to determine if the language meets all the legal requirements.

Commissioner Saunders:

• Questioned if Lake Shore Drive (Norwood Township, from Lake St. south to the county line) could accommodate a 22-FT wide pavement. Harmon stated the existing road bed width is insufficient for a 22-FT wide pavement and there may be wetland issues near the Lake Street and Lake Shore Drive intersection if the road bed is widened.

Commissioner Way:

Questioned various employee sick time usage. Harmon explained some employee's sick time usage was high
due to various excused circumstances.

Harmon stated the Michigan County Road Commission Self-Insurance Pool (MCRCSIP) totaled (wrecked) Truck #52 and he requests purchasing the truck back from MCRCSIP for \$3,100.00 to be used for parts.

Commissioner Saunders moved to authorize the manager to purchase Truck #52 from MCRCSIP for \$3,100.00 to be used for parts, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

➤ VOTE: Ayes – Saunders, Way, Ogden Nays – 0 Motion carried.

Commissioner Saunders moved to pay bills totaling \$118,108.91 and \$3,100.00 to purchase Truck #52, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

Chairman Way adjourned the meeting at 10:55 AM.

Commissioners Saunders, Way and Ogden, County Commissioners Roloff and Reinhardt, Patrick Harmon, James Vanek and Shelley Kondrat attended, along with Charlevoix County Concerned Citizens members Jerry Matelski & Connie Saltonstall, and Petoskey News-Review reporter Fred Gray.

Road Commission Clerk Shelley Kondrat opened the meeting at 9:00 AM and requested 2008 Chairman nominations.

Commissioner Ogden nominated Commissioner Way for 2008 Chairman.

Commissioner Ogden moved to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Way for 2008 Chairman, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

Mrs. Saltonstall thanked the Road Commission Board and manager for their effort and support at recent meetings with Congressman Stupak, State Representative Elsenheimer and MDOT regarding funding for the Boyne City-Charlevoix Road.

Mrs. Saltonstall said her committee is investigating funding options. A 10-15 year countywide road millage and possible bonding was discussed by all; the time length assuring voters other deteriorated county roads would be reconstructed as well (including Camp Ten Road, Springvale Road, Ellsworth Road, River Road, Six Mile Lake Road, Kings Highway, Deer Lake Road, Korthase Road, Marion Center Road, Shadow Trails and Old Dixie Highway). Congressman Stupak is investigating a possible Federal Government safety grant. Mrs. Saltonstall hopes Boyne City and Charlevoix will donate their city millage portion (or a percent of) toward the Boyne City-Charlevoix Road reconstruction.

Commissioner Ogden moved to open 2008 Annual Material Bids at 11:00 AM February 29, 2008 for March 10, 2008 Board review, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.

This funding amount became available to the first complete projects turned in for advertising. As of this date, all available funding for the North region has been obligated and no additional projects can be funded." Mr. Harmon explained 2008 Holy Island bridge funding is no longer available, but he recommends completing the engineering work so that MDOT could proceed with the bid work as soon as future funds are available; all present agreed.

Recessed at 10:05 AM; resumed at 10:15 AM.

Commissioner Saunders moved to accept and send to the County Board of Commissioners an explanation of the new union contract cost savings, seconded by Commissioner Ogden.

Commissioner Reinhardt asked if East Jordan Iron Work slag is hazardous, Mr. Harmon has a DEQ letter classifying this as non-hazardous material and will give Commissioner Reinhardt a copy.

Commissioner Ogden moved to pay bills totaling \$33,692.94, seconded by Commissioner Saunders.
